<b>Meeting Notes (Old/New Business, Decisions, Agendas)</b>

Cory Cripe is Dean of students at Logansport High School, Stephanie Shostok with Alkermes who is the manufacturer and supplier of Vivitrol, Pat George and Funke Oladele with Purdue Extension, recently received a health disparity grant for Cass County.</p> <p>Approval of December minutes Chuck motioned, Dave seconded.</p> <p>No real updates for SOC. Same as last report out. Meeting is January 21<sup>st</sup> at the Chambers room at 11am.</p> <p>Nikki is working on the quarterly report if anyone has anything they'd like to add please email it to her.</p> <p>LCC is local funding through court fees collected, money goes to the state and the state gives the counties a percentage of what is collected. DFC is a federal grant that Youth Services Alliance is the fiscal agent for. The Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition is running from the DFC grant.</p> <p>Purdue University received a grant to help with health disparities. They are observing, listening, researching what needs are in the area. They are mapping out resources and identifying what gaps there are in Cass County. They are speaking with local agencies/people in the community to prioritize what the community needs. Purdue is not here to add another group, trying to come in and assist with efforts and bring people together.</p> <p>DFC updates: next meeting is February 10<sup>th</sup> at 10am at Revolution or via Zoom. Action teams are working on different action items. They are meeting in between quarterly meetings. We are working with the schools on vaping concerns. We are also starting to coordinate community training opportunities.</p>

Stephanie works for Alkermes. Vivitrol is a once a month injection that helps with addiction. The need in the community is increasing. She is willing to volunteer to conduct trainings if the group would like.

Lisa Hutcheson was one of the people we had a discussion with about underage drinking. We may want to bring her in around April for Alcohol Awareness month. She discussed the many different topics she could cover and the team is coming up with exactly what we want that training to look like.

Jennifer announced IYI is giving out their professional development grants. \$750 that can pay for some sort of training or conference. Anyone can apply as long as the topic is youth focused. Reach out with any questions or visit the IYI website.
